

**ANNOUNCEMENT OF 29 JUNE 2018 BY WHICH THE “CARLOS V EUROPEAN AWARD – MARCELINO OREJA AGUIRRE EUROPEAN RESEARCH AND MOBILITY GRANTS FOR EUROPEAN STUDIES” OF THE EUROPEAN AND IBERO-AMERICAN ACADEMY OF YUSTE FOUNDATION ARE MADE PUBLIC.**

The regulatory bases for the “Carlos V European Award” European Research and Mobility Grants for European Studies of the European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation were approved (Official Journal of Extremadura –DOE- issue 92 of 14 May 2018) by Decree 54/2018 of 8 May.

In the seventh base of the abovementioned bases the procedure for the concession of the grants is established as competitive concurrence and that the call shall be approved by the Executive Committee of the European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation prior authorisation of the General Secretary of the Regional Government of Extremadura’s Presidency.

Thus, in accordance and in virtue of what is established in the aforementioned Decree 54/2018 of 8 May, the public call of the aid provided in Article 1 of this decree is announced.

The “Carlos V European Award” European Research and Mobility Grants for European Studies deal with European history, memory and integration, where the framework and priority is the profile of the awarded person, institution, project or initiative in each edition and it is with him/her/it that the subject of research and priorities are defined under a multidisciplinary perspective.

In the 11<sup>th</sup> edition, the Jury of the Carlos V European Award delivered the prize to His Excellency Mr. Marcelino Oreja Aguirre, acknowledging “his contribution to the European process of construction and integration during a lifetime from the different positions he has held; in national as well as in European organisations, as Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Spanish Kingdom, as Secretary General of the Council of Europe and as European Commissioner or Member of the European Parliament, among others. His contributions in the academic field and in the civil society have, likewise been active and fruitful. His tireless work to foster the idea of Europe and the aggrandizement of European values should also be highlighted, especially those related to European cultural diversity and the protection of Human Rights”.

In his discourse, during the award ceremony where he was given the Carlos V European Award, Marcelino Oreja mentioned the important progress and stages carried out in the process of European integration: the Customs Union; the introduction into the Common Market; a vast Internal Market; the Economic and Monetary Union; European Citizenship; a still insufficient Common Defence; a Common Justice and Internal Policy or the European Arrest Warrant. He, furthermore, highlighted that today the European Union is the world’s leading trading power, the

first development aid donor and the Europeans' universal vocation as they are pioneer in fostering free trade, cooperation and humanitarian aid in conflict situations. He added that "today, generalising the democratic legitimate need and responsibility in decision making is imposed, on the basis of common exercise of sovereignty. That, in my opinion, is what the European project means. It is neither a State, a Federation nor a Confederation. It is a shared public space on the basis of relinquishments of sovereignty, not so that some may make an exclusive use of it, but to share it with the rest from supranational institutions approved and valued by everyone". He quoted Jaques Delors, the first person who received the Carlos V European Award, and who always recalled that the basis of the European project is its three components: competitiveness that stimulates; a cooperation that makes us stronger and the solidarity that unites us.

Mr. Marcelino Oreja's diplomatic and professional career in the European context has always been firmly linked to his conviction that the success of the European integration process was closely related to counting with strong Institutions that had the capacity, competences and the necessary support to carry out the delicate and crucial task that enabled it to meet its end: to foster peace, democracy, development, prosperity, liberty, justice, equality, the rule of law, respect for human rights, human dignity, security, unity among the Member States and the welfare of its citizens. All this, preserving the diversity of the peoples of Europe, defending the values shared by Europeans and adopting common policies under a common model of governance, unique in the world –"Europe is not just a community of interests, but an exemplary Community of civilisation"-, known as the model of European Governance. Bearing these principles in mind, it is important to analyse which has been the progress made in order to keep improving the abovementioned model and identify the opportunities that will allow us to successfully and strategically face present and future challenges. This is why, considering the progress made in the process of European integration concerning the development of European Institutions as the amendments of European Treaties as well as the challenges and defies currently faced by the European Union, the subject and priorities of the 11<sup>th</sup> edition of the European Research and Mobility Grants for European Studies will address: **"THE EUROPEAN PROJECT'S MODERNISATION AND GOVERNANCE IN A PLURAL FRAMEWORK WITH SHARED VALUES AND GOALS"**.

**FIRST. – Objective.**

1. - The present call's objective is to offer 10 "Carlos V European Award" European Research and Mobility Grants for European Studies worth 2.500 EUR each, in order to cover:

a) The study and desk-based research, in the European field, for the preparation of the contributions that shall be presented in the framework of the *Carlos V European Award Doctoral Seminar of Multi-disciplinary Studies on Contemporary Europe*, organised in collaboration with the SEGEI (Socio-Economic Governance and European

Identity) Research Network and the University of Extremadura and that will take place at the Royal Monastery of Yuste (Extremadura, Spain).

b) The implementation of the research works carried out in the framework of the call, which will later be published in a joint work by the European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation with a prestigious publisher.

c) The researchers' mobility in order to carry out their research work, their participation in the doctoral seminar where they shall present their work and their later attendance to the presentation of the research publication.

**SECOND. - Guidance and priorities of the call: "The European Project's Modernisation and Governance in a Plural Framework with Shared Values and Goals".**

**a) Specific priorities of the call.**

The work lines of the present call that will address the subject "The European Project's Modernisation and Governance in a Plural Framework with Shared Values and Goals" are pointed out hereunder, without prejudice to the proposals that candidates may make of other innovative research lines referring to the aforementioned main subject of the call:

- The contribution of European institutions to European values and objectives throughout history by means of:
  - The development of policies, funds or European programmes,
  - The development, enforcement and monitoring of community laws,
  - The development of European initiatives and policies (Schengen, European Neighbourhood Policy, External Action Policy, the European Charter for Fundamental Rights),
  - Interinstitutional cooperation among the different European institutions and community bodies.
  - Alliances and cooperation with other international bodies and institutions, such as the UN, the Council of Europe or NATO, as an example of the most well-known.
- The role of European institutions vs. the role of the Member States and other levels of representation (i.e. regions with legislative power or local authorities).
- The evolution of the European institutions' functioning during the process of European construction and its democratic legitimacy compared to other systems, bearing in mind that the European Union is a political community under the rule of law that works as a unique model of international organisation.

- The evolution of the European Governance model, where very diverse study and analyses lines may be applied, such as:
  - The development and evolution of participation mechanisms throughout history in the process of European construction and in decision making, on behalf of other bodies and institutions –at different levels- as well as on behalf of civil society or citizens in general.
  - The development and evolution of communication and transparency policies.
  - The reform of the European Treaties and the development, functioning and efficiency of mechanisms, such as European conventions, to that effect.
  - Multilevel cooperation among European institutions and the Member States, the regions and municipalities as well as with other institutions and bodies, such as businesses, universities, associations, foundations, NGOs, other bodies of civil society and citizenship.
  - The development and evolution of the principle of subsidiarity and the role that the European Union and its Institutions have in relation to those policies that are still the competence of the Member States.
  - The distribution of competences in the European Union.
  - The development and evolution of reinforced policies.
  - The process of decision making.
  - European governance and the role of European institutions facing the challenge of Globalisation.
  
- The debate on Europe at different or two paced rhythms or at various speeds, in order to effectively meet the challenges faced by Europe.
  
- The analyses of the progress made in the development of a common defence policy, an economic and monetary policy and an asylum and refugee policy, aiming to pick out the keys that will allow these to develop in an efficient and successful way, and allow us to decide on their the model of governance and the role and competences that European Institutions should have to that effect.
  
- The concept and commitment to have a European federal model – discussed in Europe since the 19<sup>th</sup> century and one of the approaches considered when the European Communities began to develop, compared to a community model and method mainly of intergovernmental character based on an union through cooperation, concrete achievements and a phased integration, which is the one currently employed --, and the evolution and influence of this movement throughout history and of the process of European integration since its origins until present day.

- The evolution of the influence of the European Union in the international scene, the development of foreign relations and diplomacy in general, the importance of citizens and the role that citizenship and the civil society may play in the process of European construction, as factors or elements that will allow us to analyse the future of the model based on soft or symbolic power and diplomacy in foreign relations compared to the current tendency to opt for a model focused on “security” as a minimum common denominator in counterpoint to that symbolic power.
- The contribution of the European Union to the development and establishment of Peace, Human Rights, stability and progress in different world regions.
- The role of women in the process of European integration, analysing and doing research on the development of their participation in political processes and European unification and construction processes, in order to give more visibility to a traditionally invisible endeavour in the eyes of the citizens.
- The contribution made by people belonging to minority groups on the ground of cultural reasons, origin or belief, their sexual orientation, a disability, different capacities or functional diversity, to the mentioned peace process, European construction process and a process of fostering European values.
- Considering that the European Union’s action in the field of culture is limited and what it does is to complement the cultural policy of the Member States in different fields, that the cultural sector has been one of the most proactive in favour of the process of European integration contributing to the achievement of peace, development and democratic stability, the defence of human rights and the promotion of active citizenship, works that highlight the contribution of culture and the cultural sector in the process of European construction and integration are invited.
- From the first stages of European integration, different European institutions have attempted to have a **more active policy in the social field** and in contrast with the rest of the world, Europe counts with the best levels of social protection and occupies a prominent place in terms of quality of life and welfare. However, the European Union has limited competences in the social field, that mainly depend on its Member States and it constantly faces a wide range of challenges that put the development of that model and the hope to have a more social Europe at risk. Research and analyses should be carried out on how to further improve and develop the social dimension of the EU and the mechanisms used so far, such as the recently proclaimed European Pillar of Social Rights as the answer to a more active policy in the social field.

## **b) Horizontal Priorities**

Bearing the multidisciplinary character of these grants in mind, works should consider the following facts:

- The history, analysing the process of European construction from its origins in the different fields: political, institutional, operational, the relation between member countries with their neighbours, accession processes, foreign relations, especially with Ibero-America, the relations with other international bodies or the development of programmes that have enabled the exchange, mobility, cooperation, exchange of good practices, intercultural dialogue and relations among citizens, businesses, institutions and bodies of the EU.
- The recovery of the European memory and initiatives that have fostered the union and the relations between European peoples and citizens leading to an enhanced understanding, analysis and reflection on our common past in order to be better acquainted with those key moments in European history, from an analytic and critical point of view.
- The internal and external political and institutional policies that have led to the current situation including the role played by the different community institutions and bodies. In this point consider important aspects, such as political, economic, legal, commercial, cultural or security ones; or others, such as the respect for human rights, cultural exchanges, the development and strengthening of civil society, the role played by languages in these relations and in the efforts of identity developments or development cooperation as key factors in the consolidation of European values, liberty, solidarity, the promotion of intercultural dialogue and the defence of peace.
- The role played by organised civil society in the development and strengthening of the European Union's foreign relations considering the work carried out by foundations, associations, NGOs, *Think Tanks*, universities, etc. Another area of concern is to analyse the creation and development of networks, associations and entities of European character and the role they have played in this process.
- The role played by the mass media in the promotion and enhancement of institutional, political and diplomatic relations, informing, clarifying, encouraging debate and reflection, analysing the pros and cons and forging the citizens' awareness.

The works must, likewise, promote reflection around the future of the EU in its internal development and in a global context, as the promoter of peace, human rights and European values, with the aim to contribute to a better mutual understanding that favours intercultural dialogue, solidarity, the respect for diversity, good governance, inclusion policies, the fight against all types of discrimination, the promotion of equal opportunities as well as fair trade, security, citizen protection and the participation of citizens, especially the young, in the democratic process.

### **THIRD. - Requirements of the beneficiaries.**

Those who fulfil the following specific requirements before the deadline for the submission of applications, apart from those generally established in Article 12 of the Subsidies Law 6/2011 of the Autonomous Community of Extremadura of 23 March, may become beneficiaries:

1. - Be nationals of a Member country of the European Union or of one of the countries considered in this call or from third countries when proving that he/she is a permanent resident of one of the eligible countries before the date of the publication of this call.

Eligible countries of the call:

European Union (EU) Member States: Germany, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, Slovenia, Spain, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, United Kingdom, Czech Republic, Slovak Republic, Romania, Sweden.

EFTA countries that are members of the European Economic Area (EEA): Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway, Switzerland.

Countries which are candidates for accession to the European Union: Turkey, Albania, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (AYRM), Montenegro, Serbia.

South-Eastern Europe: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo under UNSC (Resolution 1244/99).

Eastern Europe and Caucasus: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Byelorussia, the Russian Federation, Georgia, Moldavia, Ukraine.

Mediterranean partner countries: Algeria, the Palestinian Authority of the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Syria, Tunisia.

Latin American countries: Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Cost Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Paraguay, Peru, Dominican Republic, Uruguay and Venezuela.

2. - Be enrolled in a doctorate programme of one of the universities of the eligible countries in the present call and be in the preparation stage of the doctoral thesis in History, Political Science, Economy, Law and other disciplines of Social and Human

Sciences, as well as other branches of science, on a subject related with the aim and guidance established in the call.

3. - Not to previously be in receipt of a “*Carlos V European Award*” *European Research and Mobility Grant for European Studies* of the European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation or of the SEGEI network.

4. - Certify the knowledge of one of the two working languages (English or Spanish), having a B2 of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) level or higher in case neither of them are the applicant’s mother tongue.

**FOURTH. - Concession procedure.**

The concession procedure of the established aid in the present call is competitive concurrence and a public call.

**FIFTH. - Selection criteria.**

1. - In order to assess the applications, the results of the yardsticks carried out by a jury who will consider the objective merits as well as the quality and appropriateness of the proposals presented in the present call will be taken into account.

The applications will be assessed and they may reach a total of 100 points according to the following criteria:

2. - The grants will be awarded to applicants who have reached a maximum score in the assessment carried out. In case of a tie in the score, the order of preference will be established according to the highest score reached in the global average grade of the academic record. If the tie remains, it will be solved by drawing of lots between the candidates.

**SIXTH. - Applications and deadline for submission.**

1. - Applications shall be formalised completing the form in Annex I of the present call.
2. Applications and the annex documentation shall be submitted via electronic means, completing the digital form published in the website: [www.fundacionyuste.org](http://www.fundacionyuste.org) (Menu: («Premio Europeo Carlos V»/Becas Premio Europeo Carlos V) and submitting the required documentation to the following email: [becas@fundacionyuste.org](mailto:becas@fundacionyuste.org)
3. The completed application form (Annex I) shall be accompanied by the following documentation:
  - a. A valid copy of the NIF and/or Passport.
  - b. A copy of the permanent resident card (only nationals from different countries to those eligible in the call).
  - c. A copy of the registration slip of the University's doctorate degree.
  - d. A copy of the Academic Record.
  - e. A copy of supporting documentation of the requirements and merits included in the application form.
  - f. A recommendation letter of the director of the thesis.
  - g. Declaration of Commitment (Annex II).
  - h. Certification of English or Spanish skills, having a B2 level or higher. (Only in case it is not the applicant's mother tongue).

The European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation may request the comparison of the copies provided by the applicant at any time in a reasoned manner, thus requesting the original document.

4. The deadline for the submission of applications will be 30 working days starting on the day following the publication of the announcement of the call and its extract in the Official Journal of Extremadura.
5. If the application form does not comply with the requirements demanded, the applicant shall be asked to rectify the error or present the mandatory documents in a period of ten working days and shall be warned that in not doing so his/her application shall be relinquished.

**SEVENTH. - Organisation, instruction and resolution of the procedure.**

1. The organisation and instruction of the procedure for the granting of aid regulated by the present call rests with the Managing Director of the European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation.
2. The instructive body will assess all the presented applications gathering on its own initiative as many actions as it deems necessary for the determination, knowledge and verification of the data in virtue of those on which the resolution proposal shall be made. At this stage, the fulfilment of the conditions imposed shall be verified to become a beneficiary of these grants, prior to issuance of the corresponding technical report, which shall be sent to the jury constituted for this purpose.
3. A jury for the analysis, assessment and ranking of the presented application forms shall be constituted and appointed by decision of the European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation's Managing Director and shall be composed by:

A President and between 8 and 14 vocals appointed among personalities from the academic and/or university field with professional careers related to the European Union and/or the subject and priorities of the present call, where one of the vocals shall serve as secretary.

The definite composition of the jury shall be published in the Foundation's website.

4. Once the assessment stage of the applications submitted is over, the jury shall issue a report where the result shall be specified and a list of the applicants,

ordered according to their score, and of those excluded and the reason for their exclusion, shall be annexed.

5. On the basis of the record and the jury's assessment, the instructive body will set out the definite resolution proposal for the concession of the grants, which -once duly substantiated- shall be taken to the competent body so that it may resolve the procedure. In this sense, the jury's report shall be binding. The resolution proposal shall be accompanied by the list of the selected candidates who may be awarded a grant in decreasing order of score and where the selected candidates shall be distinguished from substitute ones.
6. The resolution proposal shall be notified to the applicant via the email address that he/she has provided, where he/she shall be informed of the availability of the provisional list in the Foundation's website <[www.fundacionyuste.org](http://www.fundacionyuste.org)> (Menú: «Premio Europeo Carlos V»/Becas Premio Europeo Carlos V), and he/she shall have 10 working days to submit claims via the email address [becas@fundacionyuste.org](mailto:becas@fundacionyuste.org). In case no claims are made within this period, the resolution proposal will become definite.
7. Once the claims made by the applicants are examined by the jury, if these were related to the assessment made, an assessment report would be issued to the instructive body so that it may set out a definite resolution proposal.
8. The resolution of the concession procedure corresponds to the person who holds the Presidency of the Foundation's Executive Commission, prior the authorisation of the General Secretariat of the Regional Government of Extremadura's Presidency so that the processing of the subsidies may continue and their concession may be completed in accordance with the regulatory bases and the present call.
9. The final date for deciding on aid applications and notifying the resolution of the procedure shall be three months from the day following the deadline for the submission of applications. Once the deadline has been reached and the resolution of the concession has not been notified, it is understood that the application has been rejected.
10. The resolution of the procedure shall be notified individually to every applicant. The resolution of the concession shall, likewise, be published on the European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation's website: [www.fundacionyuste.org](http://www.fundacionyuste.org)
11. The resolution of the procedure shall include the grant beneficiaries, the score of all the applications as well as the obligations and commitments undertaken by the beneficiaries.

12. Once the resolution of the concession is notified, the beneficiary shall accept it in a period of five working days. If this were not the case, it will be understood that the beneficiary tacitly declines the grant.
13. The list of beneficiaries will, likewise, be published as well as that of substitutes, including the detail on the score achieved by every one of them and ranked according to the points given to the application.
14. Declinations that emerge after the publication of the resolution, the breach of obligations, supervening incapacity or any other cause that may imply the loss status of being a beneficiary, may lead to the incorporation of a new beneficiary, following the obtained order of scores.

The resolution by which the aid is granted to the substitute beneficiary will be notified to the applicant and he/she shall accept it and submit the corresponding documentation in the same terms established the fifth point of this section.

15. In the exercise of control functions and others entailing administrative powers, in accordance with that foreseen in the third additional provision of Law 6/2011 of 23 May, the resolution that puts an end to the concession procedure shall be appealable before the General Secretary of the Regional Government of Extremadura's Presidency in a period of a month from the day after the act is dictated with no detriment to the applicants who may exercise any other means that they deem fit.

#### **EIGHTH. - Funding and amount.**

1. The amount of the present call shall be funded by the European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation's 2018 budgets.
2. The amount of each grant shall be 2.500 EUR, where the total amount of the present call is 25.000 EUR.

#### **NINTH. - Obligations of the beneficiaries, payment and forms of justification.**

1. The beneficiaries of the grants in the present call are subject to the obligations that are generally established in Article 13 of Law 6/2011 of 23 March and should –following the deadlines of the present call- specifically:
  - a) Send a scheme and a summary of his/her research work in English or Spanish – in case it is sent in Spanish an English version should be provided- of no more than 8.000 characters (including spaces).
  - b) Participate throughout the doctoral seminar organised at the Royal Monastery of Yuste (in Extremadura, Spain) during the date communicated sufficiently in advance to the selected candidates.

- c) Send the complete text of his/her contribution in one of the two working languages, which will have a maximum length of 50.000 characters (including spaces and notes). The deadline for its submission as well as the norms and editorial rules for its publication shall be indicated to each beneficiary once the doctoral seminar has concluded.
  - d) Accept to become a member of Yuste's Alumni Network which gathers researchers who have participated in previous seminars.
  - e) Participate in the presentation of the collective publication which will include the final version of all the beneficiaries' contributions.
2. The payment of the grant shall be made according to the following periods: two fifths of the total after the definite resolution of the grant concession; a fifth once the Carlos V European Award- Marcelino Oreja Doctoral Seminar has concluded at the Royal Monastery of Yuste in 2018 and the remaining two fifths once the definite version of the contribution text has been submitted for its publication.
  3. The justification shall be carried out by the explicit certification of the submission of the final works (definite version), signed by the Managing Director of the Foundation.
  4. The European and Ibero-American academy of Yuste Foundation commits itself to paying the different payments of the grants in a maximum period of three months since the resolution of the call.

**TENTH. - Entry into force.**

The present call shall enter into force the day after its publication in the Official Journal of Extremadura (DOE).

**ELEVENTH. - Reimbursement of the awarded grant.**

1. Total or partial reimbursement of the awarded grant shall proceed as well as a demand for the payment of interest on arrears accrued from the effective moment of the payment of the grant until the date when the precedence of its reimbursement is agreed on, in the following cases:
  - a) Concealing or falsifying data taken into account to award the grant.
  - b) Cancellation of the university enrolment.

- c) Not finishing the research work or the unfulfilment of any of the obligations specified in the 14<sup>th</sup> base of Decree 54/2018 of 8 May.
  - d) Any other reason foreseen in Article 43 of the Subsidies Law 6/2011 of the Autonomous Community of Extremadura of 23 March.
2. When the compliance on behalf of the beneficiary is significantly close to the total fulfilment and he/she proves an unmistakable behaviour tending to satisfy his/her commitment, the amount to be reimbursed shall be determined in virtue of the principle of proportionality. It is considered that the fulfilment is significantly close to the total when the established obligations in section a), c) and d) of the 13<sup>th</sup> base have been fulfilled and the reimbursement of 20% of the total amount of the grant awarded shall be made in case section b) is unfulfilled and 10% in case section e) of the 13<sup>th</sup> base is unfulfilled.
