

## **CALL FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS “RELATIONS BETWEEN EUROPE, LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN: A MEETING SPACE”**

### **FIRST NOTICE**

---

The European and Ibero-American Academy of Yuste Foundation, the University of Extremadura (UEx) and the Ibero-American Study Centre of the Rey Juan Carlos University (CEIB-URJC) intend to convene the **International Congress “Relations Between Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean: A Meeting Space”** to be held in Guadalupe (Cáceres) on **18, 19 and 20 March 2021**.

The objectives of this Congress are to:

- Deepen the interaction that has been taking place over five centuries between Europe and America.
- Prioritise in the research that has studied this relationship, which has been shaping a historical reality in both spaces, confirmed in a cultural and material heritage in many common cases.
- Progress in studies on migration flows between Extremadura, Europe and America.
- Propose a space for debate based on the fundamental premise of the participation of young researchers in the field of Ibero-American History as a space for international historical relations.

### **RECIPIENTS**

---

Young researchers, doctoral students and doctors who have read their thesis no more than 10 years ago.

### **THEMATIC LINES**

---

The priority themes of the Congress which papers should deal with are:

1. HISTORICAL RELATIONS BETWEEN EXTREMADURA AND AMERICA
  - Influences on the configuration of the historical reality of both spaces
  - Common cultural and material heritage
  - Migratory flows between Extremadura and America
2. HISTORICAL AND CURRENT INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS: LATIN AMERICA-EUROPE
  - New thematic and/or methodological proposals

## LANGUAGES OF THE CONGRESS

---

Spanish, English and Portuguese.

## PAPER. PRESENTATION AND DEADLINES

---

The International Congress will include conferences and papers.

The plenary conferences will be confirmed in the forthcoming notices.

Those interested in presenting a paper at the **International Congress “Relations Between Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean: A Meeting Space”** can send a proposal with their name, a short curriculum vitae (degree, professional or academic position and, where appropriate, most relevant publications), the title of the presentation and a summary of approximately three hundred words to the following address: [congreso.guadalupe@fundacionyuste.org](mailto:congreso.guadalupe@fundacionyuste.org) until 1 January 2021. The presentations should be framed in one of the thematic lines of the Congress. A maximum of approximately 15 minutes shall be available for oral presentation.

The approval of the paper proposals shall be notified to the interested parties before 30 January 2021. Once the selection process has been completed, the organising committee shall communicate its reply via the e-mail address attached to the application.

## REGISTRATION

---

Once those selected have been confirmed, the procedure and deadlines for registration will be reported in a forthcoming notice. Those selected with financial assistance will have two nights of accommodation covered in Guadalupe.

Those interested may also register only as attendees, though in that case they will not be eligible to receive financial support.

**Registration will be free in any case.**

## FINANCIAL AID

---

The organisation plans to grant **up to 14 financial grants to cover the cost of the speakers’ accommodation in Guadalupe.**

Rules concerning the granting of aid (if the number of proposals is exceeded):

- Priority will be given to those presenting papers related to the thematic lines.
- Preference will be given to those who prove that they do not have scholarships/grants or contracts in force.
